Chair Mulholland called the meeting to order at 4:00 PM.

REQUEST FOR A NEW PROGRAM AT IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY: BACHELOR OF SCIENCE PROGRAM IN ATHLETIC TRAINING/ATHLETIC TRAINER

Phil Martin, Chair of the Iowa State University Department of Kinesiology, described the proposed program. Development of a stand-alone program is required by the accrediting agency. Students must graduate from an accredited program in order to sit for the certification examination. The Committee voted to recommend the approval of the proposed program to the full Board.

MOVED by JOHNSON, SECONDED by GONZALEZ, to approve the proposed program. MOTION APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY.

REQUEST TO TERMINATE GRADUATE PROGRAMS IN SCIENCE EDUCATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

Provost Barry Butler explained that terminating the graduate programs is consistent with the re-organization of the College of Education in 2005. The programs are now available as sub-tracks in the College's Department of Teaching and Learning. Current students will have the option to complete their existing program or switch to the new sub-tracks in Teaching and Learning. The Committee voted to recommend the approval of the program termination to the full Board.

MOVED by JOHNSON, SECONDED by GONZALEZ to approve the proposed program terminations. MOTION APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY.

CARVER COLLEGE OF MEDICINE ACCREDITATION REPORT AT THE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

Provost Butler explained that the accrediting agency had granted re-accreditation to the College of Medicine M.D. Program for the maximum period of eight years. A status report is due in August 2013 addressing Standard 35 – systematic review of the curriculum. Chair Mulholland asked Provost Butler to work with Chief Academic Officer Diana Gonzalez to schedule a presentation to the Committee regarding the curriculum changes in the program and how the changes will affect undergraduates.

MASTER OF ARTS PROGRAM IN SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY AND DOCTOR OF AUDIOLOGY PROGRAM IN AUDIOLOGY ACCREDITATION REPORT AT THE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

Provost Butler explained that the two programs had received re-accreditation for the maximum period of eight years. An interim report is due in August 2012 to address the development of a policy related to English proficiency and all other performance expectations.

The Committee received the report by GENERAL CONSENT.
