PROPOSED UNIVERSITY PARKING FOR FY 2013

Actions Requested:

Consider the proposed:

- Parking rate increases at the University of Iowa, Iowa State University, Memorial Union Parking Ramp (ISU), and the University of Northern Iowa;
- Changes to parking manual regulations at the University of Iowa, Iowa State University, and the University of Northern Iowa; and

Authorize the Executive Director to file the Notice of Intent to amend <u>Iowa Administrative Code</u> for Iowa State University to:

- §681-4.26 Add a new definition "Guests" to accommodate anyone visiting those that live in a particular Residence Hall; and
- §681-4.31(2) Increase the violation from \$100 to \$200 for parking in a space or stall designated for persons with disabilities to comply with loware.com §805.8A

Executive Summary: Each university has a parking system that is self-supporting. User fees and fines support operation, maintenance, and capital improvements. The parking systems do not receive any state appropriated funds.

Additional Information on the proposed rate, violation, and regulation changes, as well as financial information are provided on the following pages.

The Board is scheduled to take action on the proposals included in this memorandum at its April meeting.

Background: <u>lowa Code</u> Chapter 262 allows the Board to make rules regarding policing, control, and regulation of traffic and parking on the property of any institution under its control. It also requires notification to students 30 days prior to action by the Board to increase charges or fees at the universities.

Written notification of the amount of the proposed parking rate increases will be mailed to the student government president at each of the universities.

Each university has a:

- Manual that contains rules and regulations for parking on campus and includes information such as vehicle registration, parking permits, and fees and fines;
- System that provides many services including patrol, maintenance, repair, snow removal, resurfacing, construction, as well as meters, signage, salt/sand, equipment, and supplies; and
- Committee that oversees parking operations and proposes changes to parking and traffic regulations as well as fees and fines for their comprehensive parking program.

UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

The University of Iowa's parking system has 15,496 parking spaces for employees, students, and visitors; over 5,200 spaces in parking structures with the remaining parking on surface lots. Additional parking is available at the Studio Arts leased facility for Arts Campus activities which were displaced by the 2008 flood.

PROPOSED RATE CHANGES

The University proposes to increase parking rates for FY 2013 as shown on page 3 and parking violation rates as shown on page 4; parking violation rate increases are the first since 2002.

The FY 2013 parking rate increases presented for the Board's consideration are part of a multiyear plan through FY 2016. The University will request approval each year for subsequent years in the plan, which is shown on page 5.

The University reports that additional revenue generated from the proposed increases will be used to:

- Construct new or replacement parking capacity;
- Replace or modify facilities affected by the UIHC Children's Hospital project;
- Replace aging parking revenue control equipment;
- Support debt service and parking operations;
- Improve and increase CAMBUS service to commuter parking lots; and
- Expand commuter programs that reduce overall parking demand by faculty, staff and student.

Outstanding bond indebtedness on the University of Iowa parking system as of July 1, 2011, totaled over \$19.3 million. This amount includes \$14.1 million in remaining debt for the construction of the Melrose Avenue parking facility and \$5.2 million for the Newton Road Ramp.

IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY

Iowa State University's parking system, including the Memorial Union Ramp, has 19,382 parking spaces available for employees, students, and visitors.

The University's Department of Public Safety Parking Division primarily manages ISU campus parking operations. The Memorial Union manages the Memorial Union Ramp. Functions between ISU and the Memorial Union are coordinated, but have separate operations and fee structures.

PROPOSED RATE CHANGES

ISU proposes the fee increases for 2012-2013 as shown below.

Funds generated from the proposed increases will be used to upgrade existing lots and fund future parking improvements.

PROPOSED REGULATION CHANGES

ISU also proposes changes to its regulations as shown below.

Page 5 **lowa Administrative Code - 681—4.26(262) Definitions.** For the purposes of these rules, the following definitions shall apply unless the context requires otherwise, and all other words shall have meaning according to their common usage.

"Guests" means any person other than the person living at the designated Residence Hall.

• Justification: To accommodate anyone visiting those that live in a particular Residence Hall. This will separate them from "visitors" (any person who owns, operates or parks a vehicle on the university campus who is neither a student nor an employee.)

- Page 11 **lowa Administrative Code 681—4.31(2)** Sanction. Improper parking in a space or stall designated for persons with disabilities (4.29(262), 4.30(4)) \$100 \$200.
 - Justification: To comply with Iowa Code §805.8A.

The previous two proposed changes require an amendment to the <u>lowa Administrative Code</u>. As such, the Administrative Rules Committee must approve them.

Page 20 C. Institutional Appeals (681-4.31)

- Appeals are reviewed initially by the Traffic Appeals Board. Appeals filed by faculty, staff or visitors will be reviewed by the Traffic Appeals Board without the Student Magistrate. Appeals filed by students will be reviewed by the Student Magistrate. Appeals before the Traffic Appeals Board are written appeals.
- 6. Form of Appeal.
 - a) Written appeals. The claimant writes his/her rationale for appealing the citation on a written appeal form supplied by the DPS Parking Division office. An appeal may be written in another format at the option of the appellant. The appeal will then be read and considered by the Traffic Appeals Board Magistrate or administrative official. Notification of the disposition will be by mail or email.
 - b) Personal hearing: The claimant meets with the Traffic Appeals Board Magistrate or the administrative official in person. Consideration and the disposition may be made immediately afterwards with the claimant present or a decision sent via mail or email to the claimant.
- Justification: To combine all appeals under one entity to make it a fairer process.
 The University would have the entire Traffic Appeals Board review all appeals as a group and decide by majority. An additional student will be added to the Appeals Board.

- D. Traffic Appeals Board (681-4.31)
 - Members: The Traffic Appeals Board shall consist of representatives of the various employee groups and students on campus as follows:
 - One member of the supervisor and confidential staff recommended by the Supervisory and Confidential Council
 - ▶ Two members of the merit staff, one each recommended by the AFSCME union locals 870 and 96
 - Two members of the professional and scientific staff recommended by the Professional and Scientific Council
 - Two members of the faculty recommended by the Faculty Senate
 - ► <u>Two</u> One member(s) of the student body <u>appointed</u> recommended <u>by GSB</u>. through an interview process conducted by Parking Division
 - One member at-large recommended by the Vice President for Business and Finance, who shall serve as chair of TAB

With the exception of the student member(s), TAB members shall be appointed by the Director of Public Safety or designee, the student magistrate shall be paid an hourly wage, at a rate consistent with other DPS student employees, by Parking Division for hours devoted to TAB. The student magistrate shall be appointed at the beginning of an academic semester for a term of one year. The appointment may be renewed. The student magistrate may be removed by the Director of Public Safety or designee for non-attendance or other cause.

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3. Duties of TAB: With the exception of the student magistrate, the members of TAB shall hear appeals of parking and bicycle citations issued to faculty, staff, students and visitors at Iowa State. TAB members shall be assigned individual cases that they will shall be responsible for reviewing, understanding and ruling upon each case. TAB members may seek the advice and counsel of other TAB members on any case but the member to which it is assigned shall be responsible for making the final ruling. All cases will be reviewed by all TAB members present and all cases will be voted on with majority decision. All appeals to TAB shall be in writing and rulings shall be made on the written applications. Appellants who are not satisfied may appeal the TAB ruling to an Administrative Officer appointed by the Director of Public Safety.

The student magistrate shall hear appeals of parking and bicycle citations issued to any student at Iowa State. The student magistrate shall offer the option of either a written appeal or an appeal hearing where the appellant may argue his or her case in person. The student magistrate shall be responsible for reviewing, understanding and ruling upon all student appeals. Appellants who are not satisfied may appeal the rulings of the student magistrate to an Administrative Officer appointed by the Director of Public Safety.

Justification: To add students to the Appeals Board and combine under one entity.

MEMORIAL UNION

The Memorial Union parking ramp at Iowa State University has 627 parking stalls. Operations are managed by the Memorial Union staff rather than Parking Division staff. Ramp rates are slightly higher than campus reserved rates because the ramp provides sheltered parking.

PROPOSED RATE CHANGES

UNI proposes to increase parking rates as shown below.

The University reports that additional revenue generated from the proposed increases, effective August 1, 2012, will be used to help maintain campus parking lots.

To date, the building and maintenance of campus parking lots has been done without bonding. This fund has absorbed several large expenses in recent years, including cost sharing for the construction of the Multimodal Transportation Center, software development, and consultant fees.

PROPOSED REGULATION CHANGES

UNI also proposes changes to its parking manual regulations as shown below.

Permit and Fees

- 7.1 As identified on page 12.
 - Justification: To support increases in salaries and wages and parking lot maintenance costs.

Penalties and Appeals

- 9.3 Violation of any of the regulations governing the use of motor vehicles, bicycles, roller skates, rollerblades, and skateboards on campus will subject the violator to a penalty according to the following schedule:
 - n. Improper use of roller skates, roller blades, skateboards or scooters\$10.00 25.00 each offense
 - Justification: To discourage the activity.
- 12.7 Service permits are available to vendors and University departments for an annual fee of \$131.00 \$135.00 effective August 1 through July 31.
- 12.8 Construction permits are available to contractors working on campus. These permits will carry an annual fee of \$81.00 \$84.00 and be effective August 1 through July 31.
 - Justification: To support increases in salaries and wages and parking lot maintenance costs.

Skateboarding, Roller Blading and Roller Skating

- 13.1 **Skateboarding.** No person shall ride or operate a skateboard upon properties owned, leased or occupied by the University of Northern Iowa, including, but not limited to buildings, plaza areas, sidewalks, streets, alleys and parking lots.
- 13.21 <u>Skateboarding</u>, Roller Blading and Roller Skating. No person shall ride or operate <u>skateboards</u>, or roller blades or roller skates upon properties owned, leased or occupied by the University of Northern Iowa except:
 - a. on sidewalks and hard surface areas where bicycle traffic is permitted.
 - b. in a prudent and careful manner, with reasonable regard for the safety of the operator and other persons; pedestrians shall have the right-of-way.
- 13.32 Impoundment. Any public safety officer who observes a person violating this ordinance is authorized to issue a citation for the violation and to impound a person's skateboard if a repeat violation occurs.
 - Justification: To allow skateboarders on campus with restrictions and be more in line with policies on the SUI and ISU campuses.
