Fellow Regents:

I have attached a spreadsheet prepared by Patrice Sayre detailing the Governor's revised appropriation request to the legislature for the Regent enterprise in FY 2010. I call your attention in particular to the numbers highlighted in orange. The bottom-line is this: Governor Culver is recommending that the Regents' funding for 2010 be restored to the revised funding level for 2009 through the use of nearly \$87.5 million in ARRA (aka "stimulus") dollars from the Federal government.

Many questions remain at this point. It is not clear how this proposal will fit with the legislature's plans. It is also uncertain, assuming the Governor's proposal is enacted as presented, how we will address a potential \$87.5 million shortfall in 2011 (again, assuming that the <u>one-time</u> ARRA funds are used in 2010).

What we know with certainty is the high value Governor Culver places on public higher education for Iowa and Iowans. For that I am enormously grateful. And, confident as I am that our legislative leaders place the same high priority on the educational and research contributions of our public universities and special schools, I remain optimistic that every effort will be made to support and protect the core quality of our institutions.

Still, challenging questions remain for our elected leaders, for this Board, and for our institution heads and their teams. Once our FY 2010 state funding is finalized, I look forward to working together with all Regents to set our priorities.
