Executive Summary:

Meeting held at University of lowa

The Iowa Coordinating Council for Post-High School Education met on May 7, 2003 at the University of Iowa Oakdale Campus in Coralville.

Below is a brief summary of the major items covered at the meeting.

Acceptance of New Program Proposals

"High Risk Drinking on College Campuses" The Council discussed the report, "High Risk Drinking on College Campuses," and a presentation by Lynn Walding of the Iowa Alcoholic Beverages Division, and adopted a resolution of support of six recommendations contained in the report as follows.

- Common sense and public opinion support enactment of a state law prohibiting all-you-can-drink liquor promotions that encourage overconsumption, underage drinking, public intoxication and drunk driving.
- 2. A legislative study committee should be appointed to review restricting other alcohol promotions, within reason, and to gauge the impact and political viability of such proposals.
- A single state agency should be charged with fostering partnerships among the various entities that administer college alcohol education programs and working towards developing a comprehensive approach to reducing the incidence of high-risk drinking on lowa's college campuses.
- 4. A portion of the fees reverted to local communities from liquor licenses and profits should be earmarked and dedicated for local and statewide enforcement of the existing alcoholic beverage laws.
- All parties involved and responsible for underage alcohol sales and consumption should be held accountable, and the penalties for minors should be increased to a level that would deter underage consumption.
- 6. The State should adopt the .08 BAC intoxication level.

Economic Impact Study

The Council approved a proposal for an economic impact study and allocated up to \$10,000 to undertake the study. This study will be conducted in time to have the report ready for distribution by mid-December 2003.
