Subject: Allocation of Mandatory Student Fees and Designated Tuition for the 2003-2004

Academic Year

Date: May 12, 2003

Recommended Actions:

- 1. Approve the allocation of the Regent universities mandatory student fees for the 2003-04 academic year, including the summer 2003 session, as set forth in Tables 1-3.
- 2. Approve the University of Northern Iowa's allocation of tuition designated for student fees for the 2003-04 academic year, including the summer 2003 session, as set forth in Table 4.

Executive Summary:

In the fall of each year, the Board of Regents establishes base tuition and mandatory fees for each of the universities for the following academic year. At the subsequent May Board meeting, the Board allocates student fees for various student purposes after considering the priorities of the students.

Student Fee Committees

The <u>lowa Code</u> requires the involvement of student fee committees prior to the Board changing allocations of student fees.

The student fee committees at each university have met and made recommendations regarding the allocations of the student fees. The proposals are consistent with the student fee committee recommendations.

Types of Allocations

There are two distinct types of allocations to be made:

- 1. Allocation of certain mandatory student fees.
- 2. Allocation of a portion of tuition specifically designated as student fees.

In the fall of 2002, the Board directed the universities to phase out all designated tuition allocations into mandatory fees so that designated tuition will be completely eliminated by the 2004-05 academic year. The University of Iowa and Iowa State University have completed the transition. The University of Northern Iowa is expected to complete the transition by 2004-05.

The following table summarizes all mandatory fees and the proposed amounts of tuition to be designated as student fees.

Mandatory Fees

The Board approved each of the above mandatory fee amounts in November 2002. The Board is being requested to allocate certain mandatory fees for various student functions.

The majority of the allocations proposed for Student Activities Fees and the Student Services Fees at the Regent universities are for student government, bus service, and athletics.

Proposed Designated Tuition

The 2003-04 academic year is the final year for the University of Northern lowa to have designated tuition. The University of Northern lowa plans to increase designated tuition by \$13.10 or 17.0%, which is comparable to the approved percentage increase in tuition. Two of the largest increases in allocations include \$3.10 for Intercollegiate Athletics and \$2.60 for the Center for Multicultural Education.

Detailed Allocations

The detailed allocations of the identified mandatory student fees (Tables 1-3, pages 7-9) and the designation of tuition for student fees at the University of Northern Iowa (Table 4, page 10).

Strategic Plan:

The review and approval of the allocations for both designated tuition and mandatory fees support the Board's strategic plan, Key Result Area 4, that requires the Board to exercise effective stewardship of institutional resources to support aspirations of educational excellence and a diverse and consistent funding base.

Background:

Board Process

The Board sets tuition and mandatory fees in the fall of each year. For more than 70 years, the Board has allocated an amount for student activities and student services.

Student Fee Committee

Per Iowa Code §262.34B, a student fee committee at each university, composed of five students and five university employees, is required to make recommendations for the student fee allocations to the university president by April 15 for the subsequent academic year.

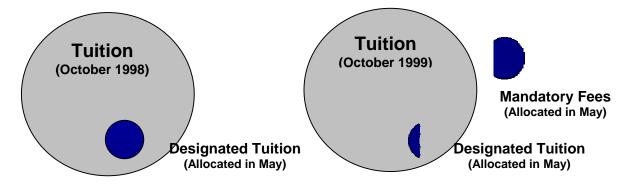
The university president, in turn, makes a recommendation to the Board

and the Board makes the final decision on the allocations of student fees. This process allows student input into the decision of how the student fees are allocated.

Redirection of Tuition

In October 1999, the Board made a fundamental change in the structure of tuition and fees by approving a request of the University of Iowa to establish new mandatory fees for certain student activities and student services rather than using tuition revenues. The change took tuition revenues that had been designated historically for student activities and student services, and established them as separate and distinct mandatory fees.



In October 2000, the Board approved a similar redirection of tuition to new mandatory fees for Iowa State University and the University of Northern Iowa. These redirections were to be implemented over a number of years.

The redirection from tuition to mandatory fees had significant consequences:

- Tuition dollars become available for academic areas and needs.
- Students pay mandatory fees rather than tuition to support specific programs that promote student activities and services.
- Students continue to pay the same amount for tuition, plus any base tuition increase approved by the Board.

Allocation of Student Fees This redirection of tuition to mandatory fees adjusted how the Board allocated student fees. In addition to designating a portion of tuition for student fees, the Board also was required to allocate certain mandatory fees.

Elimination of Designated Tuition In November 2002, the Board directed the universities to phase out all allocations of tuition and establish all student fees as mandatory fees. This will completely eliminate designated tuition by the 2004-05 academic year. The status by University is as follows:

- The University of Iowa has completed the transition this academic year.
- As reported in November 2002, Iowa State University had one remaining designated tuition amount for the Memorial Union. With the Board's approval in November 2002 to allow ISU to assume operational responsibility for the Memorial Union, the University will absorb the Memorial Union's operations. ISU's transition is thus complete.
- The University of Northern Iowa is expected to complete the transition by the 2004-05 academic year.

Analysis:

SUI

The University of Iowa is proposing allocations of the mandatory fees as identified on Table 1, page 7. The increase of \$29 in building fees is consistent with the Board's approval granted in the fall for Phase I of a multi-year, multi-phased project to renovate the Iowa Memorial Union facility.

ISU

lowa State University proposes allocations of the mandatory fees as identified on Table 2, page 8. The \$30 increase for the Memorial Union improvements is consistent with the Board's approval last November. These funds will be used for future building renovations and debt service for the Union under a capital improvement plan that is being developed.

UNI

The University of Northern Iowa proposes allocations of mandatory fees as identified on Table 3, page 9. The increases include a \$10 increase for the Panther Pass that will provide funding for the Gallagher-Bluedorn Performing Arts Center and an \$8 increase for Intercollegiate Athletics to support operational and scholarship costs. These are consistent with the Board's approvals last November.

Designated Tuition

In November 2002, the Board directed the universities to phase out all designated tuition allocations into mandatory fees so that designated tuition will be completely eliminated by the 2004-05 academic year.

- The University of Iowa and Iowa State University have completed the transition.
- The University of Northern Iowa will complete the transition by the 2004-05 academic year.

The base tuition at the Regent universities for the 2003-2004 academic year is \$4,342 per student. Of this amount, a portion is designated for student fees at the University of Northern Iowa. The University is proposing to use \$90 of this base tuition for student activities fees as illustrated in the following table. This represents a 17.0% increase which is comparable to the Board's tuition increase.

UNI

For the 2003-2004 academic year, the University of Northern Iowa proposes an overall increase in designated tuition of \$13.10 for the following:

- Intercollegiate Athletics by \$3.10 to support operational and scholarship costs. Budget cuts and tuition increases have had a significant impact on this program.
- Fine Arts/Cultural by \$2.00 to recognize the importance of fine arts as part of the total educational experience.
- Homecoming by \$0.70 to cover rising programming costs.
- Student Activities Programming by \$0.50 to allow the continuation of Thurdaze the weekly, non-alcoholic social event on Thursday evenings.
- Wellness and Recreation by \$1.40 to provide additional student staff to oversee the new Health Beat (exercise) facility in Maucker Union.
- Child Care Committee by \$1.70 to provide additional childcare grants for UNI students who are parents to help defray the cost of off-campus childcare.
- Center for Multicultural Education by \$2.60 to support diversity programming across campus.
- Panther Shuttle Bus by \$0.40 to cover rising operational costs.
- Gallagher-Bluedorn Performing Arts Center by \$0.40 to be combined with the revenues from the Panther Pass to underwrite 50% student discounts for all shows.
- Family weekend by \$0.30 (new) to enhance the weekend event by offering more entertainment and activities for families.

When combining mandatory fees and designated tuition, the University's funding of intercollegiate athletics is \$67.40 per student per year and will generate revenues of approximately \$930,000. In addition, a portion of the \$40.00 Panther Pass fee is used to provide reduced admission for students to athletic events.
